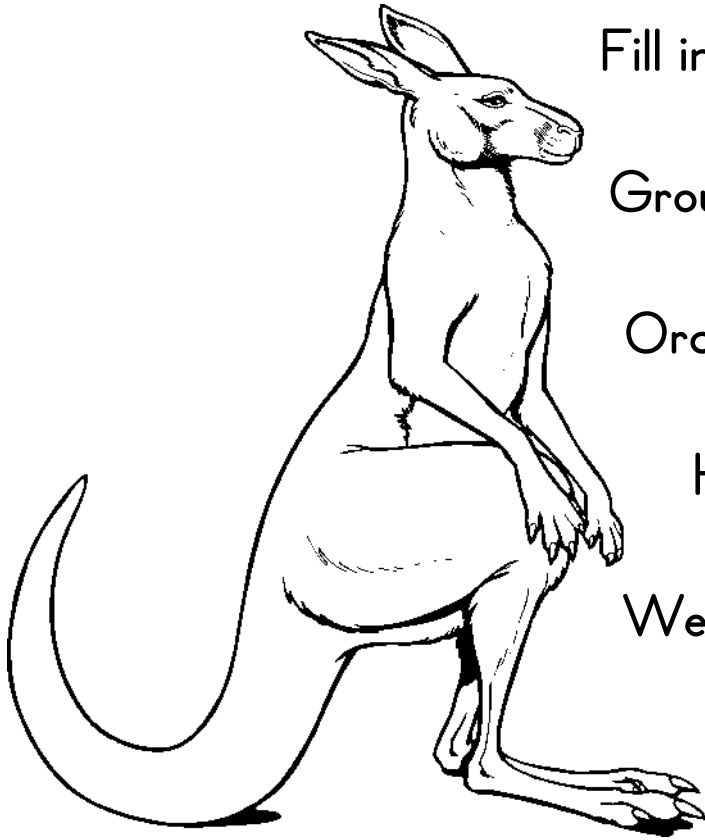
African rhinos have two horns. The rhinoceros newborns are up and running within an hour of being born.

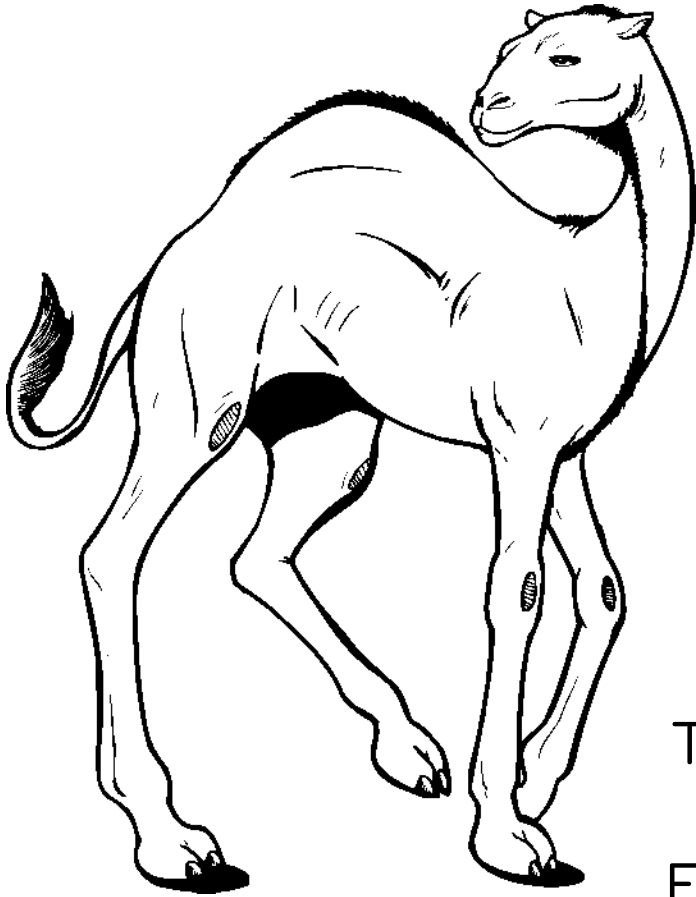
